- ◆ Now in its **43rd year**, Strawberry is a richly rooted community and a family-friendly event.
- ◆ Kindness, cooperation, and consideration for others and our environment is the foundation of the festival community.
- ◆ When we work together, and each of us does our part, we can minimize risk and protect each other.
- ◆ We are all responsible for the well-being of kids and teens at the festival. Please do not leave alcohol unattended in your camp.
- ◆ Camping is first-come, first-served. Please alert any staff member with a radio if you need help finding a place to camp.
- ◆ Practice water conservation by limiting your showers to the "Strawberry 3-Minute Shower."
- ◆ Recycle! Recycling stations are located throughout the festival.
- ◆ Reuse! Reduce waste by bringing your own refillable water bottle, dishes, and cutlery.
- ◆ Please help us leave the Nevada County Fairgrounds in better condition than when we arrived.



POLICIES

- ◆ NO firearms or weapons
- ◆ NO fires, open flames, or charcoal cooking
- ◆ NO pets - only bona fide service animals are permitted
- ◆ NO swimming, wading, or dumping of trash or debris in NID ditches or Lion's Lake
- ◆ NO sales or solicitation without written permission from Strawberry Music, Inc.
- ◆ NO drones
- ◆ NO motorized vehicles/ATVs
- ◆ NO bicycles, etc. allowed on the Music Meadow or in the Food Court. **Kids under 18 must wear a helmet when riding bicycles on fairgrounds property**
- ◆ NO dumping of greywater on grounds
- ◆ Metal detectors are not allowed
- ◆ Speed limit throughout camp is 5 MPH
- ◆ Keep access roads clear and observe all festival boundaries
- ◆ Quiet generators are permitted to run from 10 am to 2 pm daily
- ◆ Smoking and vaping are only permitted in designated areas
- ◆ Strawberry Music, Inc. is not responsible for lost or stolen items
- ◆ Strawberry Music, Inc. reserves the right to refuse service to anyone

COMMAND POST (CP)

CP is the headquarters for safety, security, and medical services available 24/7 during the festival. Please use your festival map to find the location of CP. Rude, offensive, unsafe, or abusive behavior will not be tolerated. Please notify Safety staff immediately if a situation develops that requires assistance. In the event of emergency, Sierra Nevada Memorial Hospital is less than 5 miles away.

ON THE MUSIC MEADOW

- ◆ Please be respectful to the performers on stage and other audience members
- ◆ Using cell phones for anything other than a camera is not allowed
- ◆ Video and professional lens photography is only allowed on a case-by-case basis
- ◆ Observe all posted signs and boundaries
- ◆ NO glass and NO throwing frisbee
- ◆ Remove chairs and personal items from the Music Meadow at the end of every evening

Strawberry Stroll

Strawberry Stroll staff is available to direct and assist in the orderly placement of low-back chairs in the designated area center-stage, from the front row to the sound tower.

- ◆ When you arrive, check your program to determine when the Music Meadow opens, and what time the Stroll line begins each day.
- ◆ Each person may place a maximum of 4 chairs
- ◆ **In full upright position, chair backs must be no taller than 32" from the top of the chair to the ground and there must be 10" or less from the bottom of the seat to the ground** (No chaise lounges or hook-back chairs)
- ◆ Any unoccupied chair is open for use by anyone until the owner arrives (If you do not want to share your chair, please take it with you when you leave the seating area)

General Seating & Dancing Area

Taller chairs are allowed in General Seating which starts behind Strawberry Stroll seating. Dancing is allowed in designated areas on both sides of Strawberry Stroll seating.

- ☐ Folding table
- ☐ Earplugs, eye mask
- ☐ Hand sanitizer
- ☐ Water jug (to bring water to camp)
- ☐ Portable FM radio for Hog Ranch Radio
- ☐ Chairs (for camp & Music Meadow)
- ☐ Rain gear
- ☐ Sun hat & warm hat
- ☐ Sunscreen
- ☐ Soap, towel, & flip flops for shower
- ☐ Water bottle, plate, cup, cutlery
- ☐ Instruments for jamming
- ☐ Bike Helmet (**Required** for under 18)
